

Community Invited to Restore Historic Poplar Springs Cemetery

Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service project planned January 17

The Burnsville Recreation & Learning Center and Poplar Springs Missionary Baptist Church are inviting the community to take part in a special Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service on Saturday, January 17, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m., focused on restoring the historic Poplar Springs Missionary Baptist Church Cemetery in the Burnsville community.

Dating back to approximately 1860, the Poplar Springs Missionary Baptist Church Historical Cemetery is one of Anson County’s most significant and diverse burial grounds. More than 200 individuals are laid to rest on the three-acre property, including Caucasians, African Americans, enslaved individuals, Native Americans, and free persons from the late 18th century forward. Many graves have been identified through death certificates, grave markers, historical research, and community knowledge passed down through generations.

Organizers say time, development, and neglect have taken a toll on the cemetery, with some grave sites disturbed or destroyed over the years. The restoration effort is intended to preserve the site, protect remaining graves, and ensure the cemetery remains accessible for future generations.

Community members of all ages are encouraged to participate. Volunteers are asked to bring tools such as wheelbarrows, rakes, axes, hacksaws, hedge clippers, and gloves to assist with cleanup and restoration work. Lunch will be provided by the Burnsville Recreation & Learning Center at 12:30 p.m.

The cemetery is located just below Poplar Springs Missionary Baptist Church at 332 Rocky Mount Church Road, Polkton. Organizers emphasize that the work already completed has been significant, but continued help is needed to fully protect and honor the site.

Those already involved in the restoration include Poplar Springs trustees; Lyn Thomas Grading and Kevin Thomas; Grave Hunters Vicky Matlock and Margaret Price; retired Pee Dee Wildlife Director J.D. Briken; Wingate University associates; Nix Gaddy Company; community activist Allen Jackson II; concerned community citizens from both local and out-of-state areas; and church families from Galilee Baptist Church and Saron Baptist Church.

The project is being coordinated by the Burnsville Recreation & Learning Center along with Poplar Springs Missionary Baptist Church leaders and community partners. Organizers say preserving this historic cemetery is both a responsibility and a service to the past, present, and future of Anson County.
