School Board Meeting is January 29

Public invited to attend or tune in online

The Board of Education rescheduled their regular monthly meeting to Thursday, January 29. It will be held in the Administrative Board Room, located at 320 Camden Road in Wadesboro.

Closed Session will begin immediately after the opening of the meeting at 5:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing matters related to personnel and property pursuant to NCGS 143.318.11(a)(6) and NCGS 143.318.11(a)(5).

Open Session for the public will begin at 6:00 p.m.

If the public wishes to sign up for public comment, they can sign up in-person. A sign-up sheet will be available 30 minutes before the meeting begins for any individual or group to indicate their desire to address the board. Public comment will be held during the Open Session portion of the meeting at 6:00 p.m.

For those who prefer to attend from the comfort of their couch, the meeting will be livestreamed on the Anson County Schools YouTube channel. To find it, simply search YouTube for "Anson County Schools," where viewers can watch along without worrying about parking or whether the chair squeaks when they shift their weight.

Free Tax Assistance Offered

Free income tax assistance will once again be available at Grace Senior Center for Anson County residents age 60 and older, those with disabilities, or individuals of low- or moderate-income who need help preparing their income tax returns. The program is sponsored by AARP and Grace Senior Center and is designed to turn tax-time headaches into sighs of relief.

Volunteer counselors, trained in cooperation with the Internal Revenue Service (yes, they speak fluent "tax"), will be available at Grace Senior Center on Wednesday, March 4, and Wednesday, April 1, from 9:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Free assistance will be provided for Forms 1040EZ, 1040A, 1040, and the North Carolina return.

Participants are asked to bring a picture ID, this year's tax package, age and earnings statements (W-2 forms), interest statements from banks (1099-INT forms), a copy of last year's tax return, and any other relevant income or expense information. In other words, bring the paperwork - and let the volunteers handle the math.

All individuals with appointments must pick up a tax package at Grace Senior Center prior to their scheduled time and bring the completed package with them to the appointment. Electronic filing of returns will be available, meaning no stamps, no envelopes, and no wondering if your return fell behind the refrigerator.

Appointments are required. To schedule a time or to learn more about this free and helpful service, call Grace Senior Center at (704) 694-6616. Your taxes may still be complicated, but at least they don't have to be lonely.

Programs Offered at the Health Department


Free sessions provide education, support, and resources for mothers and babies

The Anson County Health Department, in partnership with Wingate University's Doctor of Occupational Therapy Program and the WoMB Clinic, is offering a series of free educational & support sessions focused on managing health during pregnancy and the postpartum period. The programs are designed to support both physical and mental well-being for expectant and new mothers in Anson County.

Sessions will cover a wide range of topics, including pelvic floor therapy, breastfeeding and infant feeding support, mental health before and after pregnancy, baby growth and development, parenting education, and evaluation and support for perinatal pain, discomfort, and physical challenges. Each session will also include free supplies and gifts for both mom and baby.

Programs will be held at the Anson County Health Department on select Mondays from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and Thursdays from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. Upcoming Monday dates include Feb. 2, February 16, February 23, and March 2, while Thursday sessions are scheduled for February 12, February 19, February 26, and March 12.

Armed Robbery Investigation Leads To Arrest In Peachland

Deputies with the Anson County Sheriff's Office have made an arrest following an armed robbery reported at a Peachland business late last year.

According to a press release from the Sheriff's Office, deputies were dispatched to the Dollar General in Peachland at approximately 8:55 p.m. on December 18, 2025, in reference to an armed robbery. Upon arrival, deputies secured the scene, interviewed applicable parties, obtained video surveillance, and conducted a K-9 track as part of the investigation.

The investigation continued over the following days and was concluded on December 30, 2025, when deputies and detectives arrested Blair Smith in connection with the incident. Smith was charged with felony robbery with a dangerous weapon.

Smith was taken into custody without incident and placed in the Anson County Jail under a \$500,000 secured bond.

The Anson County Sheriff's Office continues to encourage anyone with information related to criminal activity to contact law enforcement as investigations remain ongoing throughout the county.

Golden LEAF Scholarship Application Now Open

South Piedmont students encouraged to apply for up to \$2,250 per year

South Piedmont Community College students now have an opportunity to invest in their future, as applications for the Golden LEAF Scholarship are officially open. The scholarship awards up to \$2,250 per year to eligible students and is designed to support those who plan to live and work in rural North Carolina communities after graduation.

To qualify, applicants must meet several requirements, including residency in a qualifying North Carolina county and status as a graduating high school senior or a community college transfer student. Students must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average, be enrolled in at least six credit hours, and have a completed FAFSA on file. Applicants must also indicate plans to live and work in a rural North Carolina community following graduation.

Applications opened January 12 and must be submitted no later than March 1, 2026. Students can apply online through Etrieve at bit.ly/ETRIEVE.

Students who meet the qualifications are encouraged to apply early and take advantage of this opportunity to help offset educational costs while building a future in North Carolina's rural communities.
