Respiratory Etiquette - Stop Germs at the Source

Here are a few tips for those suffering from a cold, to not impose on others around them.

American Red Cross Lifeguarding Course

Anson County Parks and Recreation will offer the American Red Cross Lifeguarding Course on April 26 to 28 and May 3 and 5. Friday, 5 p.m., Saturday, 9 a.m. and Sunday, 1 p.m. The class will be held at the Anson County Parks and Recreation Pool in Wadesboro. CPR/AED/First Aid Renewal will be taught on Friday May 3 starting at 5 p.m. The deadline to enroll will be Friday April 19.

To be eligible for the Lifeguarding course the participant must be 15 years of age on or before the final scheduled session of this course. The participant must successfully complete the following:

- 1) Swim 300 yards continuously, using these strokes:
 - The 300 yards may be a combination of front crawl and breaststroke
 - The front crawl and breaststroke must use rhythmic breathing.
- 2) Starting in the water, swim 20 yards using front crawl or breaststroke, surface dive 7-10 feet, retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface, swim 20 yards back to the starting point with the object and exit the water, without using a ladder or steps, within 1 minute, 40 seconds.
- 3) Tread water for 2 minutes while arms crossed and hands under armpits.
