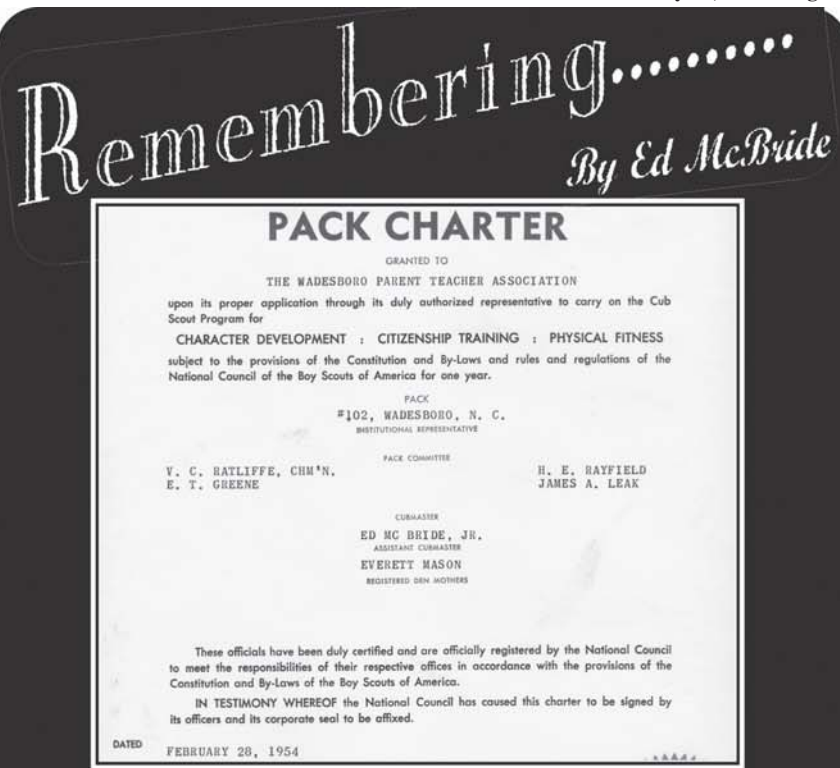

1954 Cub Scouts Pack Charter

The scouting program has been active for a number of years here in the Wadesboro area. I was aware of this and my memory was "awakened" last week while looking for some other items in the file. I saw some old records, among which was a 1954 Boy Scout Pack Charter #102, granted to the Wadesboro Parent Teacher Association on February 28, 1954. It shows V. C. Ratliffe, Chairman, and Elwood T. Greene, Hubert E. Rayfield and James A. Leak as the pack committee. Cub Master was Ed McBride and assistant was Everett Mason. Some, but not all, of the Cub Scouts were Dicky Morris, Sandy Drye, Jimmy Leak, Gene Rayfield, Everett Mason, Elwood Greene and Tommy McBride.

In the 1950's the Cub Scouts met at a home basement the old Methodist Church and the former Tarlton Furniture Store. This was a time before the church was torn down and replaced with the the present First Methodist Church facility.

The Wadesboro Civitan Club also has been a very active supporter and promoter of the scouting program here, with some attaining the honored rank of Eagle Scout.

I was talking with Foyle Hightower about some of the scouting programs - he dates back to Eagle 1955. Sandy Drye dates back to Eagle 1958. There were, of course, others through the years, and Foyle and Sandy are still going! Ed

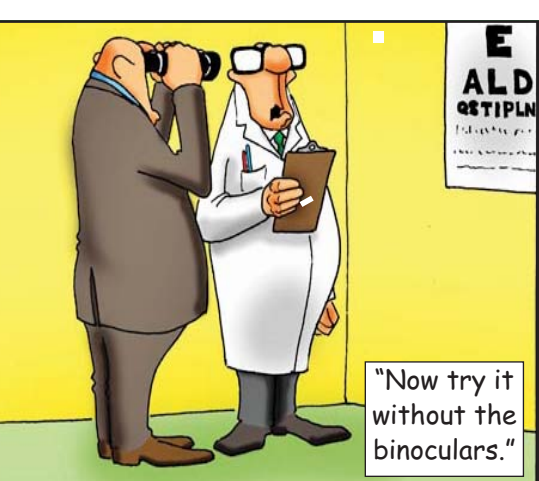
