# **South Piedmont Receives** \$500,000 Digital Champion Grant

South Piedmont Community College is one of 63 community service, nonprofit, higher education, and regional organizations that will receive \$30 million in Digital Champion grants to help North Carolinians access and use high-speed internet. The grant program, funded by the federal American Rescue Plan Act, will expand digital equity programming and advance digital inclusion and opportunity across the state.

"We are thrilled to have been awarded these funds, and we can't wait to put this grant to work for our community, said South Piedmont President Dr. Maria Pharr. "Internet access is a non-negotiable for modern students, yet significant gaps in digital access exist within our service area. This grant will help South Piedmont to close the digital divide and put higher education within reach for more residents of Anson and Union counties.

South Piedmont has received \$500,000 in Digital Champion funding. The money will be used for a number of initiatives, including studying students' internet access; connecting students with community resources to access the internet; providing enhanced internal resources, such hotspots available by reservation; installing one additional on-campus laptop checkout kiosk; promoting the College's Digital Literacy course and providing tuition vouchers for students who take the course.

# **David Duncan Arrested** for Assaulting Elderly Citizen

On Friday, July 12 at approximately 9:35 a.m. the Wadesboro Police Department responded to a residence on Arbor Street in reference to a welfare check. When officers arrived it was apparent that the elderly resident had recently been assaulted. Officers determined that the assault took place the night prior at the residence. The

victim was taken to Atrium Anson with serious head and facial trauma. Shortly after, warrants for the arrest of David Duncan, 52, were obtained.

Duncan, a resident of Richmond County and currently on Post Release (formally known as Parole) was taken into custody at approximately 3:35 p.m. by Hamlet Police Department. Duncan was charged with Assault Inflicting Serious Bodily Injuries and Assault on an Elderly Person. There are likely to be more charges forthcoming due to the ongoing investigation by the Wadesboro Police Department.

Duncan is currently in the Anson County Jail under a no bond NC Post Release Warrant.
