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Letter from Superintendent Howard E. McLean

Dear Anson County Stakeholders,

Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! As we open our doors on August 28, the start of school is a chance for us to reflect on our school district's goals:

- Anson County Schools (ACS) will ensure every school creates a positive school environment where all students and staff want to attend, learn, and work as measured by yearly climate surveys. Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) strategies will be implemented with fidelity at every school in order to decrease the number of major and minor student incidences by 10% yearly.
- Anson County Schools will reduce overall chronic teacher absenteeism by 5% yearly to 42% in 2022 to 40% in 2023 to 38% in 2024.
- By 2024, Anson County Schools will utilize an instructional framework to deliver a differentiated student-centered approach to learning, resulting in a grade level proficiency composite growth from 41.9% (2018 data) to 46.9% (2021), 51.9% (2023), and 56.9 (2024)%.

Every opportunity for continuous learning will be given to our students as we continue to focus on improving ways for students to become active participants in the global community. Every challenge that emerges will be thoughtfully discussed and reviewed by a team of educators, administrators, board members, parents, and students when appropriate. Areas of concern such as instruction, health and safety, social-emotional wellness, family and community engagement, and operations issues will continue to be addressed throughout the year. Continuously monitoring changing circumstances and direction from governmental agencies will guide our path forward. Our decisions will be based on data and science while keeping the safety of students and employees as our first priority.

Our district continues to thrive because of the unwavering commitment of our amazing employees, and we are eager to move forward on our path toward a successful school year. We appreciate everyone's contributions, including all of the hard work and determination put forth by our employees who have been participating in summer learning and professional development sessions focused on improving learning for our students.

Lastly, we cannot do our work and be successful without partnering with our community. Stakeholders, we encourage you to consider supporting our school improvement teams, parent/teacher organizations, athletic and extracurricular programs, and other school volunteer opportunities. Connecting with these organizations and programs along with our teachers, principals, counselors, and support personnel is critical at this time to ensure that the tradition of a high-quality public school education within the Anson County School District continues now and in the future.

Security Beefed Up at Peachland-Polkton Elementary School

Peachland-Polkton Elementary School strengthened school security over the summer. PPES recently installed 3M Safety and Security Window Film on all external doors and entries. This film helps prevent unwanted entry by hardening the window's glazing. It will greatly reduce an intruder's ability to breach any door or glass, on which it is installed. It is designed to hold shattered glass in place to effectively slow down an intruder, giving students and teachers critical time to get to safety and for security personnel to respond before entry occurs.

Additionally, 3M Safety and Security Window Film helps to protect occupants during natural disasters. Major weather events and earthquakes may cause the glass to break.

Dr. Travis Steagall, Principal of Peachland-Polkton Elementary School, stated, "The 3M Safety and Security Film will increase our school safety efforts at PPES. We take school safety very seriously and consider keeping our students and staff safe our most important priority."

High Tech Security Camera System Installed at PPES

Through a partnership with the Polkton Police Department, a Flock Security System camera was recently installed at Peachland-Polkton Elementary School. Chief Tim Hutchinson considers the camera to be a priority and worked with the Polkton Town Council to obtain funding for the camera system.

Flock Safety's License Plate Reading Cameras will enhance school and community safety. License plate reading cameras work because roughly 70% of all crime is committed with the use of a vehicle. So, whether it's vandalism, theft, or other suspicious activity, Flock Safety's technology will quickly identify a suspect's vehicle. If a crime does occur, Flock can automatically alert local law enforcement. PPES is thankful for Chief Hutchinson and the Polkton Town Council's commitment to safety.
