Message from Coach Luke Hyatt

The Anson Bearcats Football Program enters the 2014 season confident and prepared to compete.

The Bearcats' 11 game schedule opens up with a trip to Forest Hills on Friday, August 22 to face rival Forest Hills.

The Bearcats are coming off the 2013 season which saw Anson advance to the second round of the 3-A playoffs. The Bearcats return a wealth of experience on the defensive side of the football, with seven starters returning from last season, including All-Conference selections Lamonte Snuggs and Devonta Teal.

Offensively, senior QB J'Maine Harris returns for his second season under center for the Bearcats. His 16 touchdowns last year ranked second on the team, and J'Maine looks to improve on those numbers in 2014.

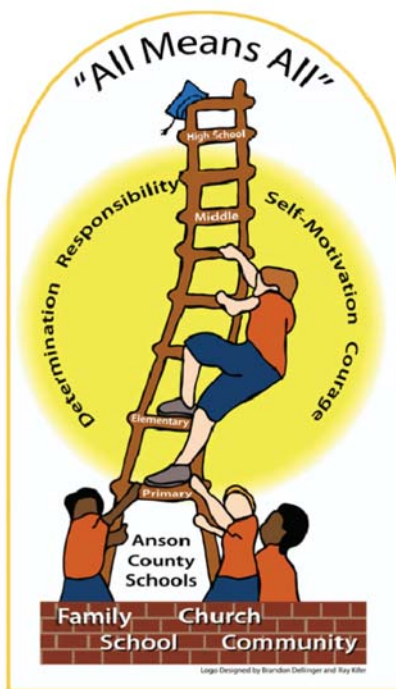

Anson County Schools will be implementing "Make Your Day" in all schools. This student management program deals with student behavior and student responsibility for that behavior. All student behavior issues will follow the guidelines for "Make Your Day" using steps, points, and Step-4 Conferences.

Prohibited Behaviors That May Result in Suspension:

1. Being in an unauthorized area
2. Disrespect of faculty/staff
3. Disruptive behavior
4. Inappropriate language/disrespect
5. Aggressive behavior
7. Skipping class
8. Leaving school without permission
9. Use of tobacco
10. Under the influence of a controlled substance
11. Cell phone use/wireless communication devices
12. * Truancy
13. * Tardiness
14. Gang activity
15. Bullying

* The penalties for truancy and tardiness can not exceed two days.

Long-term suspensions will be limited to serious violations of the Code of Student Conduct that either threaten the safety of students, staff, or school visitors, or threaten to substantially disrupt the educational environment.

(Required by General Statute 115C-228)

1. Assault resulting in serious injury
2. Assault involving use of a weapon
3. Assault on School Personnel
4. Bomb Threat
5. Arson of a School Building
6. Death By Other Than Natural Causes
7. Kidnapping
8. Possession of Alcoholic Beverage
9. Possession of Controlled Substance
10. ** Possession of Firearm or Powerful Explosive
11. Possession of a weapon
12. Rape
13. Robbery WITH a dangerous weapon
14. Robbery WITHOUT a dangerous weapon
15. Sexual assault
16. Sexual offense
17. Taking indecent liberties with a minor

** Mandatory 365-day suspension

All of the above offenses are Long-Term Suspensions.

No long-term suspension shall be imposed on a student until an opportunity for a formal hearing is provided to the student.

Fighting

1st Offense

Any affray deemed a fight by school personnel will result in an automatic 10-day suspension at the high school, and a 10-day suspension at the middle school. Elementary principals retain the right to determine action taken.

2nd Offense

Student will face long term suspension recommendation.

Student must comply with the Code of Student Conduct in the following circumstances:

1. while in any school building or any school premises before, during, or after school hours;
2. while on any bus or other vehicle as part of any school activity;
3. while waiting at any school bus stop;
4. during any school-sponsored activity or extracurricular activity;
5. When subject to the authority of school employees; and
6. At any place or time when the student's behavior has or is reasonably expected to have a direct and immediate impact on the orderly and efficient operation of the schools or the safety of individuals in the school environment.
