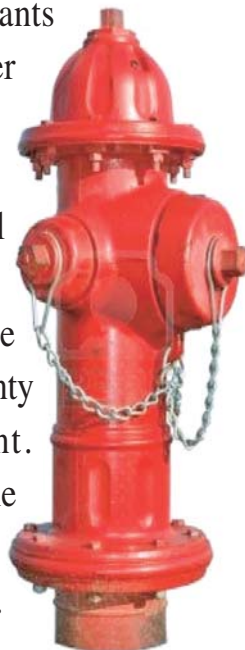

Becoming a Certified Pesticide Applicator

Pesticides include plant growth regulators, defoliants, desiccants, insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, and many other '-icides'. Some pesticide applicators are required by state and federal law to become certified and licensed.

You do not need a pesticide license or certificate if:

- You apply general-use pesticides on your own property or as a volunteer, for example at a community garden.

You ARE required to have a pesticide license and certificate if:

- You apply pesticides for compensation, are an applicator working for a state/local government, a dealer selling restricted use pesticides, or are a pest control consultant.
- Farmers must have pesticide certification if they wish to apply restricted-use pesticides to their own crops.

North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (NCDACS) Pesticide Section administers and enforces the pesticide program to protect public health, safety, welfare, and minimize and manage risks associated with legal pesticide use. There are difference types of licenses. A producer applying restricted-use pesticides to an agricultural commodity on their own farm would need a Private Pesticide Applicator Certificate. Someone paid to treat for household pests would need a Structural Pesticide Applicator's Registered Technician Card, Certification, or License. A landscaper hired to apply fungicide on turf or insecticides to a home garden would need a Commercial Ground Applicator's License. Public Ground Operators are licensed employees of federal, state, county, municipal governments, or public utility operators who apply pesticides in the course of their job.

First step is to determine what type of license and subcategory of application you will be operating under, the corresponding training manuals, sign up for a Pesticide School or an exam-only option, and pass the exam with least a 70%. Two in-person exam opportunities are coming up in September and November in Union County.

Transportation Officials Urge Safety Around Railroads

The N.C. Department of Transportation is reminding people to stay off railroad tracks after multiple incidents involving a train and either a vehicle or pedestrian. Already this year there have been 51 incidents with vehicles and pedestrians on railroad tracks in North Carolina. Ten people have died.

"That's why we're always reminding people to be very careful around railroad tracks," said Jason Orthner, director for NCDOT's Rail Division. "Railroads are only meant for trains. Drivers should obey traffic laws and never stop on the tracks. Also, people should never walk, jog or take pictures on railroad tracks. Doing so is extremely dangerous."

Staff in NCDOT's Rail Division also urge people to follow these tips:

- If there is an emergency at a railroad crossing, call the number on the blue sign at the crossing. This is the fastest way to alert the railroad.
- Pedestrians should always cross the railroad at safe legal crossings such as bridges, underpasses, and railroad crossings with signage.

NCDOT's Rail Division is working with communities and planning organizations to reduce the number of at-grade railroad crossings by building more bridges and underpasses. These projects are eligible for funding under the state's 10-year

transportation plan because they have been shown to improve safety and reduce highway and rail congestion.
