Thinking back, some of the lighter everyday things were - like working at the A&P, Belks, etc., with prices like Eight O'Clock coffee for 15¢ per pound (ground to your liking), five pound bag of sugar, maybe 19¢, loaf of bread 10¢, sometimes a weekend special for canned beans or peas was only two for 15¢. And, cars back then were less than \$1,000 for a new Chevrolet, Ford or even some of the Buicks. No turn signals, air conditioning, tinted glass, electric windows or door locks. Only straight drive (manual shift) and a heater! Of course the auto extras are another story this day and time!

readers" remember the Coke in the returnable bottle for 5¢...well, the list goes on. The other side of the coin was some of the salaries. Some of us were making beginning salaries of \$10 per week for Monday through Saturday (6 days). Even after I began sign work for a living, often I would letter a truck - both doors, unit numbers, etc. - for as little as \$5!

These memories are just a "drop in the bucket." We have seen so many changes and are so very appreciative for so many kind and caring blessings.

 - Perform a pre-trip and post-trip daily ... documenting and reporting findings to the manager on duty ASAP and RTR, so arrangements can be made to correct the problem.
 - Responsible for contacting the Manager on duty as early as possible when unable to work, so other arrangements can be made for coverage.
 - Knowledgeable of multi routes and areas with the ability to read and understand maps.
 - Train other drivers as needed.
 - Keep all logs and driving reports up to date and accurate.
 - Make all deliveries on time and damage free.
 - Treat each and every customer as they are the most important, maintaining good customer relations.
 - Report any problems, delays (in excess of 20 minutes) to the office ASAP.
 - Re-secure the load as needed between stops.
 - Pick up money and checks as directed on paperwork ... calling credit with any discrepancies.
 - Assist with truck routing to insure sequenced correctly.
 - Ability to operate a forklift, with and without a carpet pole.
 - Pick up all returns, off load and placing in return bin.
 - Fuel vehicle at the end of each trip.
 - Complete daily paperwork and turn into shipping at the end of the shift.
 - Attend all Safety and Staff meetings.
 - Must meet and follow all DOT requirements.
 - Adhere to all Company Policies and Procedures.
 - Wear complete JJ Haines uniform & safety shoes.
 - Maintain STOP / 3D / Forklift Certification Training.
 - Strive for continuous job process improvements.
 - Perform other work as directed by the Distribution and Shipping Manager.
