Anson County residents may register to vote by mail or in person at the Board of Elections Office. The deadline to register to vote on Election Day is **5:00pm Friday, October 12, 2012**. If you are registered to vote in Anson County (and your name or address has not changed) you DO NOT need to register again to vote in this election.

Absentee by Mail voting is available upon request from the Voter, a near relative or legal guardian. Application may be made in person at the Anson County Board of Elections Office, or in writing to the Anson County Board of Elections at PO Box 768, Wadesboro, NC 28170.

The deadline to apply for an Absentee by Mail ballot is 5:00pm, Tuesday, October 29th, 2013.

One-stop voting will begin on Thursday, October 17th and ends on Saturday, November 2, 2013 at the Charles Riddle Center of The Anson County Board of Education – 320 Camden Road Wadesboro, North Carolina (**ENTER OFF CAMDEN ROAD ACROSS FROM THE WADESBORO ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**). The hours of operation will be Monday through Friday 8:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., and Saturday November 2nd 8:30 am – 1:00 pm.

In person registration (and voting) will be available during One-stop voting but not on Election Day. Only the TOWN OF MORVEN does not offer Absentee Voting.

Absentee meetings: The Anson County Board of Elections will meet to approve applications for absentee ballots for the November 5, 2013 Municipal Election at the Board of Elections office, 101 S. Greene Street Wadesboro, NC 28170 pursuant to G.S. 163.230.1(c1). Other business may be transacted by the board at this time... **TUESDAY NOVEMBER 5TH AT 2:00 PM.** Absentee by Mail ballots will be counted on **TUESDAY NOVEMBER 5TH AT 2:00 PM.** Results for Absentee Mail and One-Stop voting will be reported after polls close at 7:30pm.

Canvass Day meeting will be held in the Board of Elections Office on Tuesday, November 12, 2013 at 11:00am.
