### **Cheraw Jazz Festival in Dizzy's Hometown**

Dizzy Gillespie's hometown of Cheraw, SC ushers in its 19th year of the South Carolina Jazz Festival October 18-20 with a weekend of great jazz and exciting activities. The weekend, which coincides with the 107th anniversary of Gillespie's birth, will showcase the unique bond Gillespie shared with his South Carolina roots & jazz.



A wide variety of free and ticketed concerts and events are scheduled for the weekend of Friday, October 18 through Sunday, October 20. Two additional free concerts are planned for Thursday, October 17 that include a lunchtime concert at Northeastern Technical College and a kick-off evening concert at Dizzy Gillespie Homesite Park. This year's festival will culminate on Sunday, October 20, with a concert at the historic Old St. David's Episcopal Church in Cheraw.

Over 30 Jazz performances are scheduled during the festival that includes in-school performances. The concerts will feature regional musicians from both North and South Carolina and beyond. Featured artists for the ticketed evening performances at the Theatre on the Green will be saxophonist Dr. Michael White with "Sounds of NOLA" on Friday, October 18. Trumpeter Joe Gransden will perform at the Theatre on the Green Saturday, October 19 and present "Celebrating Diz and the Great American Songbook."

Weekend activities include free performances at Cheraw's Centennial Park, a Be-bop parade, evening jazz crawls, lunchtime and breakfast jazz, and afternoon jazz. A free concert will be presented at the Gillespie family's home church, Wesley United Methodist Church featuring Cheraw native Dr. Robert Gardiner.

Art abounds during the weekend with the festival's 16th Italian Madonnari Chalk Competition. Additional art related activities include pine needle basket artist, Kids' Art Alley, Art on the Green, caricature artist, musical sculpture exhibit and

community art installations. Visitors can enjoy a self-guided Historic Cheraw Cell Phone Tour to over 25 points of interest, including Dizzy Gillespie related sites. # **2026 Anson County Real Property Revaluation**

Anson County is in the process of reappraising all real property located in the jurisdiction of Anson County. This is following the requirements listed in General Statute 105-286 requiring that counties must reappraise all real property at least every 8 years. General Statute 105-286 also requires all real property to be valued at market value as of January 1 of the year of the reappraisal.

Anson County will have trained real estate appraisers visiting all real property to collect information for determining the market value of your property. The appraisers will be measuring all new improvements that have been added to the property not listed on the property tax card and taking photographs.

The appraisers will have identification badges, and their vehicles will have identification signs.
